The 40+ team slashed a few more seconds off the record set in the 4 x 400 a couple of weeks ago. This time **Andrew Evans** joined in the festivities, teaming with **Paul Skipper, Danny Hecker** and **John Schuijers** to record 3:46.0 Apparently this time is only a few seconds off the world 40+ record!

Nick Rosa had another big day, adding a couple of metres to his best hammer performance before representing the Club in the long jump, shot put, pole vault and the relay.

The **Minko** girls both ran their best in the 200m. **Corinna's** 25.94 equalled an earlier effort, but this time there was no gale helping out, while **Romy** broke the 30sec barrier for the first time.

Our senior women's teams are a little down on numbers this season, but **Sofie Fabre** is doing her best to rack up some points for the side. Apart from her more preferred 800 and 3000m events, Sofie also had ago at the 200m and the shot put. It's efforts like this, evident every week by many of our athletes, that make Collingwood such a great Club!

The 5000m saw a good roll up of Magpies scoring valuable points in the quest for the finals. **Ken Duxbury** continued his good form while **Jim Hopkins** ran his best for a couple of seasons. **Simon Blyth** ran his first 5k for a few seasons, while **Anthony Mithen, Malcolm Campbell** and **Tony Hally** all scored good points for the black and white. **Shane Derby**, another 'multi eventer', put in another top effort as his fitness continues to improve. **Paul Twining** set a Club 60-64 Record of 19:28.7 taking nearly 1min 27secs off the mark set by **Mike Boylen** (yes father of Chris) back in 2000.
